<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> New Jersey attorneys who provide at least 25 hours of services in adult guardianship matters are permitted to claim an exemption from the <u>Madden v. Delran</u>, 126 <u>N.J.</u> 591 (1992) pro bono requirement for the subsequent year. The <u>Madden</u> exemption is available to attorneys who are appointed by the court to serve as (i) attorney for an alleged incapacitated person; (ii) Guardian Ad Litem in a guardianship matter; (iii) temporary pendente lite guardian; (iv) permanent guardian of an adjudicated incapacitated person; or (v) special medical guardian.
